Coax is expensive, but it costs less for NKARC members. Extra Belden 8214 coax was ordered and is being sold to club members at 182¢ a foot. There should be over 750' still available by the next meeting. (8214 is 32¢ a foot locally).

If enough interest is shown in the coax venture and more is wanted, another order could possibly be placed at a future date. But you must be a club member to get the good rate (membership is only \$2 yr.)

JANUARY S.E.T.

The Simulated Emergency Test plans have begun. The communications mngr., KAMEE, will head up this years event.

The operation will center around the newly installed 2 mtr antenna at the trailer site. We'll get an idea of what areas can be covered with the new ant.

NOTE: Using a repeater with the 2 mtr antenna during the S.E.T. will enable all mobiles to hear how good the new ant is hearing. Without a repeater, only the base station operator knows the coverage obtained. Also, without & repeater, a mobile often calls in while another one is transmitting. A repeater will eliminate most of this.

K4JBV has stated that the No. Ky. Amateur Repeater Assn.'s repeater is available for TEMPORARY use during the S.E.T. Or maybe WB4VOA has a repeater that can be TEMPORARILY used for this event.

U HAVE A BEAM ?

A master file of literature on beam antennas is being started by Joe Burke, WASOGS. This file will include specs, assembly instructions, parts #s, and dimensions of all beams (it may take quite a while to gather the info - but you can help).

Why the master file? A number of

reasons:

1) help you select your next beam

2) compare construction techniques 3) get dimensions from file and build your own beam - a lot cheaper

4) order ant. hardware for that homebrew beam (parts from manufactured beams work great, but you must know the part # to order).

NEEDED: all literature you have on your beam (especially single band). Put the info in an envelope with your name and call and give it to WA80GS at the next NKARC meeting. The info will be returned to you promptly.
