PATENT APPLICANT

For the past six years, Joe Rice, W4RHZ, has been pursuing a patent for a system of stereo on the standard BC band. He has done all the work himself - from the design to acting as his own attorney.

New comers to amateur radio may not know of W4RHZ - one of the real pioneers of radio in this area. Joe's main interest

at present is in measuring frequencies, on which he recently gave a talk at the local GCARA meeting. And you probably won't find anyone that can copy morse code faster that he can.

Joe has built most of his own equipment which, to pick only one incident, he used in 1968 in the Falmouth tornado. He was first on the scene and was the only communication link out of the Kentucky town, operating on 6 mtr am.

WARHZ has worked as engineer for just about every radio station in the area at one time or other. And all this without any formal electronics schooling.
