And the VHF bands (two and six meters) will see far fewer "skip" openings due to sporatic E. Why not make the best of the good conditions that occur. The National Bureau of Standards. WWV, broadcasts propagation information on their frequencies daily (5, 10, 15 mhz etc.) at 14 and 18 minutes after every hour.
