## MINUTES (JULY 176)

The meeting was called to order by club president Roger Troy, VB8 HS. The minutes of the previous meeting were approved as read. A round-table introduction followed.

- A field day summary was given: 380 contacts on low bands, and 112 on six and two meters. These are approximate figures.

- Security at the club trailer was discussed - with emphasis given to those who use it to be sure to close all windows and turn off all lights, etc. A combination lock has been put on the trailer and the gate.

- The following motion was made:

- Harold Blocher, VB4VOA, will organize communications for the Campbell County Park Boat Races.

- Dennis Lampe, WASKIY, will file a SASE with the QSL bureau for the club.

## TWO METER OPENING

One of the strongest two meter openings ever occurred on Field Day weekend, Sunday June 27.

Six meters was open the entire day on the 27th, with the entire U.S. being

heard at one time. Everything from VEL (New Brunswick, Canada) to V6 (Calif.), and south to VP2 and KP4 (Caribbean area)

was being heard.

Having such a strong opening on six meters is often an indication that the MUF (maximum usable frequency) is quite high - maybe high enough for two meter 'sporatic E' propagation. And sure enough, it was. Stations are reported to have worked all over the eastern U.S. on two meter SSB. There was also activity on two meter fm. (Did anyone locally work this opening?)
