The October 23, 1976 total eclipse of the sun will provide a unique opportunity for DXers to observe the effects on radio propagation in the 10-, 15-, and 20-meter bands along the path of totality that lies between the east coast of Africa and the Australian continent.

From outside the earth, the moon's shadow will appear as a dark elliptical spot of slightly varying width averaging 180 kilometers in diameter. It will touch the earth south of Lake Victoria at sunrise at 0339 GMT; it will pass over Zanzibar Island shortly thereafter and next over the Farquhar Group at 0350 GMT. Continuing eastward, it will cross the entire Indian Ocean and finally strike the southeastern tip of Australia at 0637 GMT. About three minutes later the shadow will pass over Melbourne and will leave the earth at sunset, south of Lord Howe Island.

During the period of totality and near totality, there should be a temporary return to nighttime propagation conditions, possibly accompanied by abnormal behavior of the signal strength which should be carefully noted.
